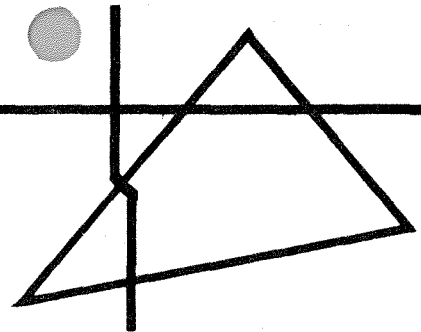

Bilingual Education in the Pacific

Completion of the Tate/SPC Oral English Syllabus by the production of core materials and the systematic expansion of teaching and learning materials continues at the Regional English Teaching Center in Suva. Two series of developmental readers should be available by mid-1975: Paul and Tina, a series of 20 flip-books for beginning readers, with colored illustrations, and Look!, a series of 20 illustrated booklets on the everyday activities of a Pacific Islands family. In production is Time to Sing, a book of songs geared to various stages of the Tate/SPC syllabus.

Also a language teaching specialist has been added to the SPC staff who is designing and testing materials for teaching French in the Pacific context to pre-school and primary school children whose mother language is not French. She is currently conducting pilot classes in two schools on Ouvea (Loyalty Islands).
