



Director's Note

Cop-Out was first produced in 1968, during all the tumult of the Vietnam War. Much in the world has changed since then and yet much has remained the same. Images of police in riot gear standing off against angry protesters around the globe continue to assault us in the media. We see the protester as lazy, jobless, and liberal; we see the protester as an energetic, motivated world-changer.
