In 1990, the U.S. Department of Education established the first Language Resource Centers (LRCs) at U.S. universities (including the UH

National Foreign Language Resource Center) in response to the growing national need for expertise and competence in foreign languages. Nearly twenty years later, there are fifteen LRCs, supported by grants under Title VI of the Higher Education Act, creating a national network of resources to promote the teaching and learning of foreign languages. 
