1. STATE OF THE JOURNAL

Founded in 1997, LLT is currently in its fourteenth year of publication and continues to receive a robust number of submissions and an ever-increasing readership. Current figures show our number of subscribers as 15,430, an increase of 14% since 2008 and 35% since 2006. In 2009, LLT received 139 submissions from 26 countries. This represents an 8.5% decrease in submissions since 2007. The greatest number of submissions came from the U.S. (32 submissions), followed by Taiwan (20 submissions), Iran (12), Turkey (11), and PRC (10). See Appendix 7 for a list of 2009 submissions by country.

In a 2009 Thomson Reuters report in ScienceWatch (http://sciencewatch.com/dr/sci/09/mar15-09_1D/), LLT was ranked in the top 20 Education Journals based on our ISI (Institute for Scientific Information) impact factor of 1.222. In 2008, our impact factor rose to 1.700 and our five-year impact factor was 2.067. In addition, a 2008 article by Belz and Vyatkina received the prestigious ACTFL Pimsleur award in 2009.

As part of LLT's professional outreach and mentoring, our editors continue to conduct and take part in yearly workshops at national conferences such as CALICO (Computer Assisted Language Instruction Consortium), AAAL (American Association of Applied Linguists) and TESOL (Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages) to familiarize novice and veteran researchers with the essentials of conducting and publishing CALL research.

1.1 Staffing & Board Updates

In June 2010, Sigrun Biesenbach-Lucas will step down as Reviews Editor. We wish to sincerely thank Sigrun for all her work over the past five years and wish her continued success in all her future endeavors. Paige Ware will be joining us as the new Reviews Editor starting with our October 2010 issue. We would like to warmly welcome Paige to the LLT family and look forward to working with her.

Matthew Prior, current Managing Editor, will step down in December 2010 as he finishes his doctoral degree in the Department of Second Language Studies at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. Daniel Jackson, a first year PhD candidate in the Department of Second Language Studies, will take over as editorial assistant in December 2010.

1.4 Subscriptions

The number of subscribers increased from 13,569 in 2008 to 15,430 in 2009. This shows a 14% increase since 2008 and an impressive 81% increase since 2006. See Appendix 1 for details and a breakdown of subscribers by language(s) taught. While the number of subscribers who teach English, Spanish, and French still remain the highest overall, 2009 saw a continued increase in subscribers who teach Other (98%), Russian (54%), and Chinese (42%).

1.5 Readership

Hits data shows that our readership remains very healthy both for old and new issues. Hits information is provided in Appendix 2: Summary Statistics for Readership from 1/1/04 to 12/31/09, and Appendix 3: Readership of Volumes 8 through 12 (1/04-12/31/08).

The extensive online report feature provided by our Web Production Editor, Carol Wilson-Duffy, continues to provide interesting information about the LLT web site. The current report is located at http://llt.msu.edu/report2009/ and includes the overall yearly statistics as well as detailed information on activity, access, visitors, and browsers. Reports for the two previous years can be found at http://llt.msu.edu/report2008/ and http://llt.msu.edu/report2007/.

1.6 Submissions and Acceptance Rate

The number of submissions decreased by 9% in 2009 with 139 manuscripts compared with 152 in the previous year. The acceptance rate for 2009 was 5%, continuing a trend since 2003 in which the rate has decreased from 20% to 17% to 13% to 10% to 10% to 6% to the current 5% (see Appendix 4).

1.7 Reviewers

Our network of active outside reviewers is large enough that we continue to prune and remove inactive, inexperienced, and poor reviewers from our list and put their names in a separate database. We have discussed in the past the possibility of launching a program to increase our knowledge about reviewer specialties with a questionnaire for our current pool of reviewers. This has not yet been followed up, but could be a task for 2010/2011. Special Issues Editors are especially helpful in bringing in new reviewers. We may also wish to ask Board Members to more actively recommend potential reviewers.

We utilized Board Members significantly less in 2009 (7) than in the previous years (10 in 2008 and 14 in 2007) (see Appendix 6). We may wish to consider encouraging Board Members to become more actively involved in reviewing. The average number of reviewers per manuscript was 3 for new submissions and 2 for resubmissions, very similar to previous years. 65% of requests to review were accepted (133 total requests; 86 acceptances), compared to 82% of requests to review in 2008 (121 total requests; 99 acceptances) and 2007 (62%). As with other journals, we have found it becoming increasingly difficult to find good reviewers, as many expert reviewers are asked to review by multiple journals. Many thanks go to the 75 individuals who reviewed manuscripts in 2009 (78 in 2008). Reviewers were acknowledged in Volume 14, Number 1 (February 2010). We especially wish to thank our Board Members who volunteered to do reviews on short notice in cases when the expected review fell through.

1.8 Review Process

The length of time between submission and publication for manuscripts submitted during 2009 was 487 days (~16 months). This was an increase of 12% from 2008 (433 days). Part of this increase is attributable to the difficulty in getting reviewers to respond or agree to review.

The average number of days from submission to decision for internally rejected manuscripts was 4, the same as the previous 3 years. It took 109 days between submission and decision for those manuscripts reviewed externally. This was only 2 days longer than in the previous year (see Appendix 4).

1.9 Book and Software Reviews

Reviews were handled by Sigrun-Biesenbach Lucas (See Appendix 5). We published 7 reviews in 2009, 2 more than in 2008. Readership statistics for the reviews can be seen in Appendix 2. Reviews are still unsolicited and we are working to increase the number of reviews for non-English materials.

1.10 "Emerging Technologies" Column

The "Emerging Technologies" column by Bob Godwin-Jones remains popular as evidenced by the number of hits recorded (see Appendix 3). Bob continues to incorporate the special issue themes into his column topics.

1.11 Special Issues

Our 2009 publications included two special issues in our Back to Basics series. In February 2009 we published a special issue on *Technology and Learning Grammar*, edited by Trude Heift, and in October 2009, we published *Technology and Learning Pronunciation*, guest edited by Debra Hardison. Completing our Back to Basics series in the June 2010 issue is *Technology and Learning Vocabulary*, edited by Irene Thompson. Future special issues in the works are *Multilateral Online Exchanges* (guest editors: Lewis, Chanier, Youngs, *Technology and Learning Autonomy* (guest editors: Reinders and White), *Hegemonies in CALL* (guest editors: Lamy and Pegrum), and *Technology and Less Commonly Taught Languages* (editor: Irene Thompson).

1.12 Commentaries

We did not publish any commentaries in 2009, compared to 2 in 2008 and a record 4 in the 2007.

2. ONGOING INITIATIVES

2.1 Online Management System

In light of the increased workload for our staff due to the steady flow of submissions, in 2009 we investigated Open Journal Systems, ScholarOne/Manuscript Central, and various other online management systems as replacements for our cumbersome Filemaker and e-mail system. After investigating the options, we decided to follow the lead of many other academic journals and move to ScholarOne/Manuscript Central. In March 2010, we officially went "live" and are now working to ensure a smooth transition. All manuscript submissions, reviews, and decisions are now managed through the online system at http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/llt.

2.2 Website

In October 2009, we updated our CALL Theses page (http://llt.msu.edu/calltheses.html) with the most recent CALL dissertations and we wish to thank Anne Rimrott (Simon Fraser University, Canada) for compiling the current list of Canadian dissertations and Jason Vickers (University at Albany, State University of New York) for updating the list of U.S. dissertations.

We are currently working to update the LLT Website and are also revising instructions for authors and reviewers. Other initiatives for the Website include: (1) recommendation feature for LLT articles (e.g., e-mail this article; export this citation, or add to favorite articles); (2) ability to browse articles by column;




2.3 Suggestions for Changes and Additions
