Faculty in Action

Recently, one among our LIS faculty set a shining example of education in action by giving back to Ma'ili Elementary School in Wai'anae. **Dr. Luz M. Quiroga** worked with the Mānoa College of Education Director of Technology and Distance Programs, Paul McKimmy, and several other professionals in November 2008 to rebuild 22 laptops once designated for eWaste – a type of electronic disposal.

The Ma'ili Elementary School had no computer lab prior to November 2008. In effort to help Ma'ili bridge the digital divide, Paul McKimmy and many more volunteered to set up the lab, with the

renovated laptops and even going as far routing the wiring. The rebuilt laptops function through a central server donated by the Pan-Pacific Distance Learning Association. The students also enjoy a free Linux operating system, and open source office/educational software, the latter coming from the Hawai'i Open Source Education Foundation.


