About the composers

Byron K. Yasui holds a B. Mus. Ed. from the University of Hawaii and M.M. in composition from Northwestern University. He has studied composition with Armand Russell, Neil McKay and Anthony Donato. He presently studies with Alan Stout at Northwestern University where he is working toward a Doctor of Musical Arts.

Dennis Kam is currently working toward a Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Illinois. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from Oberlin College Conservatory of Music and Master of Music degree from the University of Hawaii, and has studied at the Mozarteum Academie in Salzburg and at Toho-Gakuen School of Music in Tokyo. In 1964 and 1968, he was one of the winners of the annual Broadcast Music, Inc. awards. He has studied composition with Raymond Vaught, Joseph Wood, Cesar Bresgen, Armand Russell, Yoshiro Irino, Ernst Krenek and Salvatore Martirano.

Emmett Yoshioka holds a Bachelor's degree in Composition from the University of Southern California. He has won several awards in composition and performance and, in 1965, participated in the Edinburgh Festival. Presently a member of the United States Military Academy Band, he plays baritone saxophone in the Band's Saxophone Quartet and has composed a work for this group.
