RE: MRS. KIKUNI WATARIDA MORIWAKI

Mrs. Kikuni Latarida Mariwaki wishes to secure proof of her American citizenship, if possible. She has no papers but was born in Hilo on February 9th, 1889. Have you any records which would give her proof of her birth on that date?

Would you also have a record of her marriage and of her husband's death, the former occurring in 1908 and the latter in 1918. Briefly the facts in her case are as follows:

Father -- Kannosuke Watarida Mother -- Waka Hatarida

They were born in Japan; came to Hawaii in 1888 as part of Fifth Company; went to Hilo. Kikuni Watarida (Moriwaki) was born February 9, 1899, in Hilo. When she was about 5 years old (1893 ?) her parents took her, her three-year old youngest brother, her older brothers and sisters who had been bom in Japan, back to the home country. Kikuni came back to Hawaii as a picture bride; reached Honolulu on December 27th, 1907 where she was married to Koichi Moriwaki, Junuary 1908 at Imaigration Station. From there they went to Laupahoence, Hawrii, to live. January 1918, Kikumi, her husband and the second of their two children, went to Japan. Her husband died there in March of the same year. Kikuni returned to Hawaii in July 1918 (by herself) and came to Kausi where she has lived ever since except for a visit of three months in Japan during 1930.
