- ① 3 historians did a 700-800 page historical discussion for State of Hawaii - in the mid 1970s - only 2 copies in existence - Bill Tan has, John Briscoe has seen.
- ② ~ 1990 - Briscoe (John) did a 150-200 page legal & strategic analysis of the history & law for State Ab (Bill Tan has) - focused on "Historical Waters" claim, rather than Archipelagic Claim - his focus -

Historical waters in channels - existed as of 1897.
