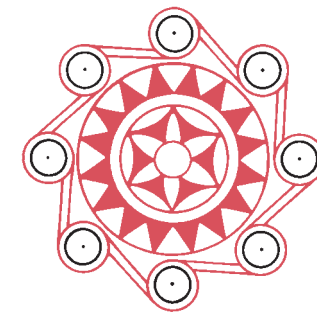

Information for Contributors

ASIAN PERSPECTIVES welcomes articles concerning the archaeology and prehistory of Asia and the Pacific region. The editors also consider papers on ethnoarchaeological subjects, prehistorical linguistic reconstruction, historical analyses relevant to archaeological debates, and physical anthropology and ethnography of use to the prehistorian. The editors welcome suggestions for special issues devoted to particular theoretical topics, methodological approaches, or regions within Asia and the Pacific.

Manuscripts are peer-reviewed by two or more suitable specialists. Research articles range in length between 6,000 and 10,000 words (including references and endnotes) with 10–15 figures. The editors accept proposals for longer articles that synthesize work on an important topic in Asian or Pacific archaeology that has seen little previous publication in English. We also invite short (800 words maximum) scholarly comments on previously published articles that add significant viewpoints to issues in Asia and Pacific archaeology. *Asian Perspectives* also publishes reviews of single books (2,000 word limit) and review essays (5,000 word limit). Readers who wish to memorialize the passing of important members of the fields represented in this journal are also welcome to submit scholarly obituaries to *Asian Perspectives*.

Prospective contributors should consult the Submission and Style Guidelines, available for download at www.uhpress.hawaii.edu/title/ap/. Style generally follows the *Chicago Manual of Style*, Seventeenth Edition (University of Chicago Press, 2017). Document sources using the author–date system in chapter 15. Spelling follows *Webster’s Third New International Dictionary of the English Language*, Unabridged. *Asian Perspectives’* readership is highly varied, so authors should avoid technical language. All articles are published in English. We allow judicious use of non-English characters in the manuscript provided they are accompanied by English translations; authors are responsible for the accuracy of these characters.
