
VANDERBEEK FILM PROGRAMS

STAN VANDERBEEK was born in 1931, The Bronx, New York; studied at Cooper Union, Black Mountain College; film maker, student of non-verbal communication; films available through Vanderbeek, Stony Point, New York; exhibitions, Lincoln Center, Museum of Modern Art, Berlin, Vienna, etc.

Vanderbeek has for many years been concerned with experimental film productions and non-verbal communication. Major projects include the "Movie-Drome" which he built near his Stony Point home—an audio-visual laboratory for simultaneous dance, magic theater, sound, and films; and computer graphics: the development of films and graphics resulting from man-machine dialogue.
