

1972 EAST-WEST CENTER SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The E-W Center announced that as of April 10th new degree scholarships had been awarded for 1972-73 to 8 Pacific Island students--4 from the Trust Territory, 2 from New Guinea, and 1 each from Niue and American Samoa. Presently there are 23 degree students under EWC scholarships in residence at Manoa from the Pacific: Cooks-1, Fiji-4, New Guinea-3, Western Samoa-2, Tonga-3, and Trust Territory-10.

ON-GOING U.H. RESEARCH (continued from April 10th NEWSLETTER)

Dr. Agatin Abbott (Geology and Geophysics) - conducting research on manganese nodules on the ocean floor in the Hawaii area, and on geothermal resources in Hawaii.

Dr. Doak Cox (Geosciences) - engaging in applied environmental research in Hawaii.

Dr. John Rose (Geology and Geophysics) - working on navigational problems associated with the 10-months' cruise of the U.H. ship Mahi.

Mr. David Kittelson (Hawaiian Collection) - doing research in Hawaiian bibliography, UH history, and Hawaiians abroad in the early 19th century.

Dr. Gavan Daws (History) - working on a biography of Father Damien which should be published in 1973.

Dr. Donald Johnson (History) - working on books dealing with the City and County of Honolulu and the U.S. in the Pacific.

Drs. Satoru Izutsu (Human Development), Floyd Tilton (Public Health) and George Fargo (Special Education), in cooperation with district medical officers, are engaged in the development of a Manual for Health Assistants in the Trust Territory. Field testing and training activities are to follow.

Dr. Donald Topping (Linguistics) - principal investigator for Micronesian linguistics research. There are approximately 12 people working on the languages of Micronesia, bi-lingual dictionaries, reference grammars, standardized spelling.

Dr. Albert Benedict (Microbiology) - studying the immune response and antibodies of the sea turtle from Hawaii.

Dr. Kaare Gundersen (Microbiology) - engaging in marine biology study of ocean surrounding the Hawaiian Islands.

Dr. Norman Meller (Political Science) - establishing linkage with professional colleagues in Pacific Islands for joint comparative legislature studies.

Mr. Herbert Rosenbush (Sea Grant) - working on Hawaii Marine Atlas for the State. It will delineate shoreline use and land ownership, list beach parks, surfing areas, etc.

Dr. Robert Earickson (SSRI) - developing urban social indicators for Hawaii to predict short-term changes and to provide feedback for normative models.

Dr. George Losey (Zoology) - studying behavioral ecology of cleaning fishes in Eniwetok, and fish mimicry as protection from predation.
