TOP LEVEL SPC REVIEW COMMITTEE

A top level committee composed of representatives from the member nations of the South Pacific Commission met in Nauru, May 3 - 7 to review and evaluate the functions and organization of the Commission. These meetings were held as a result of the conclusions, reached by those attending the Commission meetings in Nauru last year, that a thorough reappraisal of the role of the SPC was called for. The South Pacific Commission was established in 1947. Prefatory to the Top Level meetings was the appointment of a two man Commission which is to carry out independent investigation of the SPC functions and report to the Review Committee.

MICRONESIA OCCUPATIONAL CENTER

The Micronesia Occupational Center, directed by Dr. Lawrence Kane, Department of Curriculum and Instruction, University of Hawaii, is conducting courses this summer on the development and organization of industrial and vocational education curricula in Palau District, Trust Territory of the Pacific. In addition to offering 4 College of Education credit courses and 4 vocational education content courses, the MOC project is to plan a one year (1976-77) Vocational Education Teacher Training Program in which a minimum of 10 vocational education teachers from the Trust Territory will pursue a 12 month program of advanced undergraduate coursework in the UH system.
