

July 26-29, 1950 – No Gun Ri, South Korea

U.S. commanders ordered their troops to kill civilian refugees, as a defense against disguised enemy soldiers. The Koreans had been roused from their villages by the U.S. troops, and were ordered into an area under a bridge.

200-300 were killed, including women, children, and old men.
