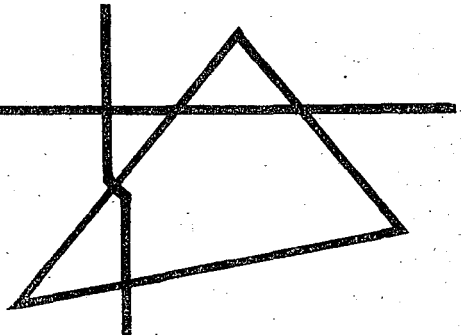

## Architectural Developments

Recent developments by the UH Department of Architecture's Tropical and Development Studies Program include establishment of research field stations at Honiara and Manila. The Honiara station is staffed by Mr. Donald Woolard, a former graduate of the Department, and has underway the development of a number of relocation centers for in-migrants from the outer islands of the British Solomon Islands. Construction of housing and the development of service capsules has proceeded and a number of villages are now in existence using these concepts.

The Manila research center is operated by A. Bruce Etherington and is currently studying and developing proposals for urban renewal in squatter areas of greater Manila.
