Ua puka maila ‘o ia me ke kēkelē laepua (BA) ma ka ha‘awina Hawai‘i, me ke kēkelē laeo‘o (MA) ma ka ‘ōlelo me ka mo‘okalaleo Hawai‘i ma Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, Koleke ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i o ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i ma Hilo, a me ke kēkelē lae‘ula (PhD) ma ka puolo ma ke Kulanui o Otago ma Aotearoa.

Keola Donaghy is the faculty coordinator of both the Institute of Hawaiian Music and Music Studies at the University of Hawai‘i Maui College. He received a BA in Hawaiian studies and an MA in Hawaiian language and literature from Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, College of Hawaiian Language at the University of Hawai‘i at Hilo, and a PhD in music from the University of Otago in New Zealand.

He hoa polopeka ‘o ku‘ualoha ho‘omanawanui ma ka māhele ha‘awina no ka ‘Ōlelo Pelekānia ma ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i ma Mānoa, kahi āna e lawelawe nei i luna no ke a‘oa‘o ‘ana i nā haumāna muapuka, a ‘o ka mo‘olelo Hawai‘i kāna kumuhana i loea ai. Ua puka kula maila ‘o ia me ke kēkelē laepua (BA) ma nā ha‘awina Hawai‘i, me ke kēkelē laeo‘o (MA) ma ka ho‘omana Polenekia, me ke kēkelē lae‘ula (PhD) ho‘i ma ka ha‘awina ‘ōlelo Pelekānia ma ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i ma Mānoa. Ua pa‘i ‘ia a‘ela kāna puke mua ‘o *Voices of Fire, Reweaving the Literary Lei of Pele and Hi‘iaka* e ka Hale Pa‘i o ke Kulanui o Minnesota (MH 2014), kekahi puke ma ka mo‘opuke Mellon Nā ‘Ao‘ao Hou ma ka Ho‘omana ‘Ōiwi.

ku‘ualoha ho‘omanawanui is an associate professor of Hawaiian literature and undergraduate chair, English Department, University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa. She received a BA in Hawaiian studies, MA in Polynesian religion, and PhD in English from the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa. He polopeka kākō‘o ‘o Kale Langlas i likaia mai Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, Koleke ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i o ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i ma Hilo. Ua puka ‘o ia me ke kēkelē lae‘ula (PhD) ma ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i ma Mānoa ma ka Māhele Hulikanaka. E pa‘i ‘ia auane‘i kā lāua ‘o Kapali Lyon mau puke ‘elua nona ka inoa ‘o *The Mo‘olelo Hawai‘i of Davida Malo* (Hale Pa‘i o ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i). Ua pa‘i ‘ia kekahi puke nāna a me 18 kūpuna nona ka inoa ‘o *Under the Volcano: The People of Kalapana, 1823–2010* (Pili Productions) ma ke kau hā‘ulelau, 2016.

Charles Langlas is a retired associate professor of Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, College of Hawaiian Language at the University of Hawai‘i at Hilo. He received a PhD in anthropology from the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa. A two-volume edition of *The Mo‘olelo Hawai‘i of Davida Malo* by him and Jeffrey Lyon will soon be available from University of Hawai‘i Press. *Under the Volcano: The People of Kalapana, 1823–2010* by Langlas and 18 kūpuna was published by Pili Productions in fall 2016.

Ua puka maila ‘o ia me nā kēkelē laeo‘o (MA) a lae‘ula (PhD) ma UCLA no nā ‘ōlelo a me nā mo‘olelo o ka Hikina Kokohe, a me ka laeo‘o (MA) ma ka ‘ōlelo me ka mo‘okalaleo Hawai‘i ma Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, Koleke ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i o ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i ma Hilo. E pa‘i ‘ia auane‘i kā lāua ‘o Kale Langlas mau puke ‘elua nona ka inoa ‘o *The Mo‘olelo Hawai‘i of Davida Malo* (Hale Pa‘i o ke Kulanui o Hawai‘i).

Jeffrey Lyon is the chair of the Department of Religion at the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa. He received an MA and PhD from UCLA in Near Eastern Languages and Literatures and an MA from Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, College of Hawaiian Language of the University of Hawai‘i at Hilo in Hawaiian Language and Literature. His and Charles Langlas’s two-volume edition of *The Mo‘olelo Hawai‘i of Davida Malo* will soon be available from University of Hawai‘i Press.

‘ŌIWI PARKER JONES

He polopeka noi‘i ‘o ‘Ōiwi Parker Jones ma ke Kulanui o Oxford. Ma laila ‘o ia i puka ai me ke kēkelē laeo‘o (MPhil) a lae‘ula (DPhil). Pili kāna noi‘i i ke kālai‘ōlelo a me ke kālai lolo. Hoihoi ‘o ia i ka hana e pono ai nā kaiaulu ‘ōlelo (a me ka lolo kanaka) ma hope o kekahi ‘ino nui. He keiki o ka ‘āina, ua komo ‘o ia i ka Pūnana Leo o Hilo, Kula Kaiapuni o Keaukaha, a me Ke Kula ‘O Nāwahīokalani‘ōpu‘u.

‘Ōiwi Parker Jones is a research fellow at the University of Oxford, where he completed his master’s (MPhil) and doctoral (DPhil) training. He maintains dual-research profiles in linguistics and in computational neuroscience, in both cases focusing on the recovery of damaged language systems. Growing up, he attended the Pūnana Leo o Hilo, Kula Kaiapuni o Keaukaha, and Kula ‘o Nāwahīokalani‘ōpu‘u.

He a‘o pū nō ‘o ia i ka mākau ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i o ka pae kula ki‘eki‘e ma Ke Kula ‘O Nāwahīokalani‘ōpu‘u. Noho ‘o ia ma Ka‘ūmana, Hilo, me kāna wahine aloha ‘o Hanakahi a me kā lāua mau kaikamāhine ‘o Keanokualani me Keakamaluhiwa.

Dr. Hiapokeikikāne Kichie Perreira is an associate professor at Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, College of Hawaiian Language at the University of Hawai‘i at Hilo where he is privileged to teach classical Hawaiian literature. He also teaches advanced Hawaiian language arts at the Hawaiian immersion school Nāwahīokalani‘ōpu‘u. He lives with his wife, Hanakahi, and their two daughters, Keanokualani and Keakamaluhiwa, in Ka‘ūmana in the Hilo district of Hawai‘i Island.
