

**Livingston v. Ewing,**

601 F.2d 1110 (10<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1979)

The State Museum of New Mexico in Santa Fe permitted only Pueblo Indians to sell craft items in the covered portal in front of the state-owned Palace of the Governors, fronting on a tourist-filled square.

A Caucasian couple moves from New York and seeks to sell their crafts at the same location, arguing that the limitation violates the Fourteenth Amendment.

Who wins?
