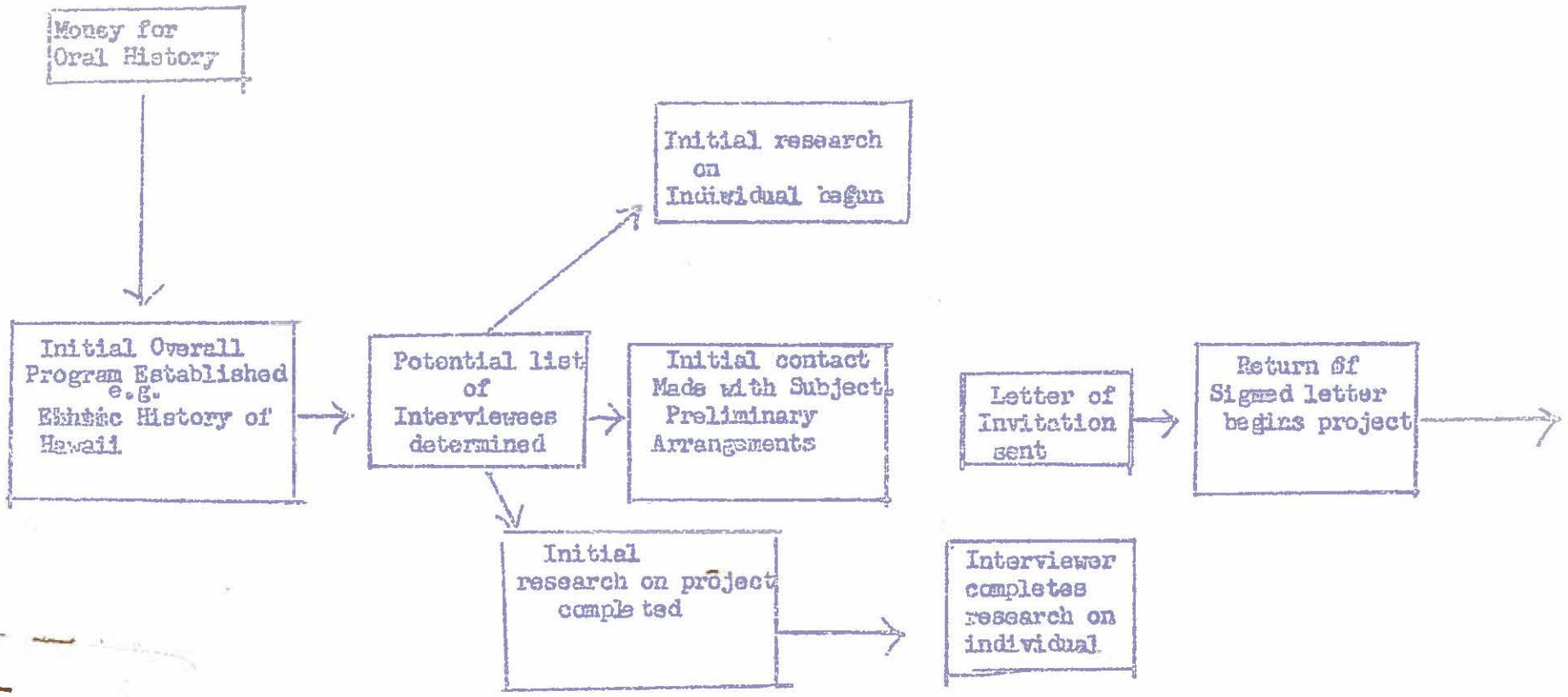
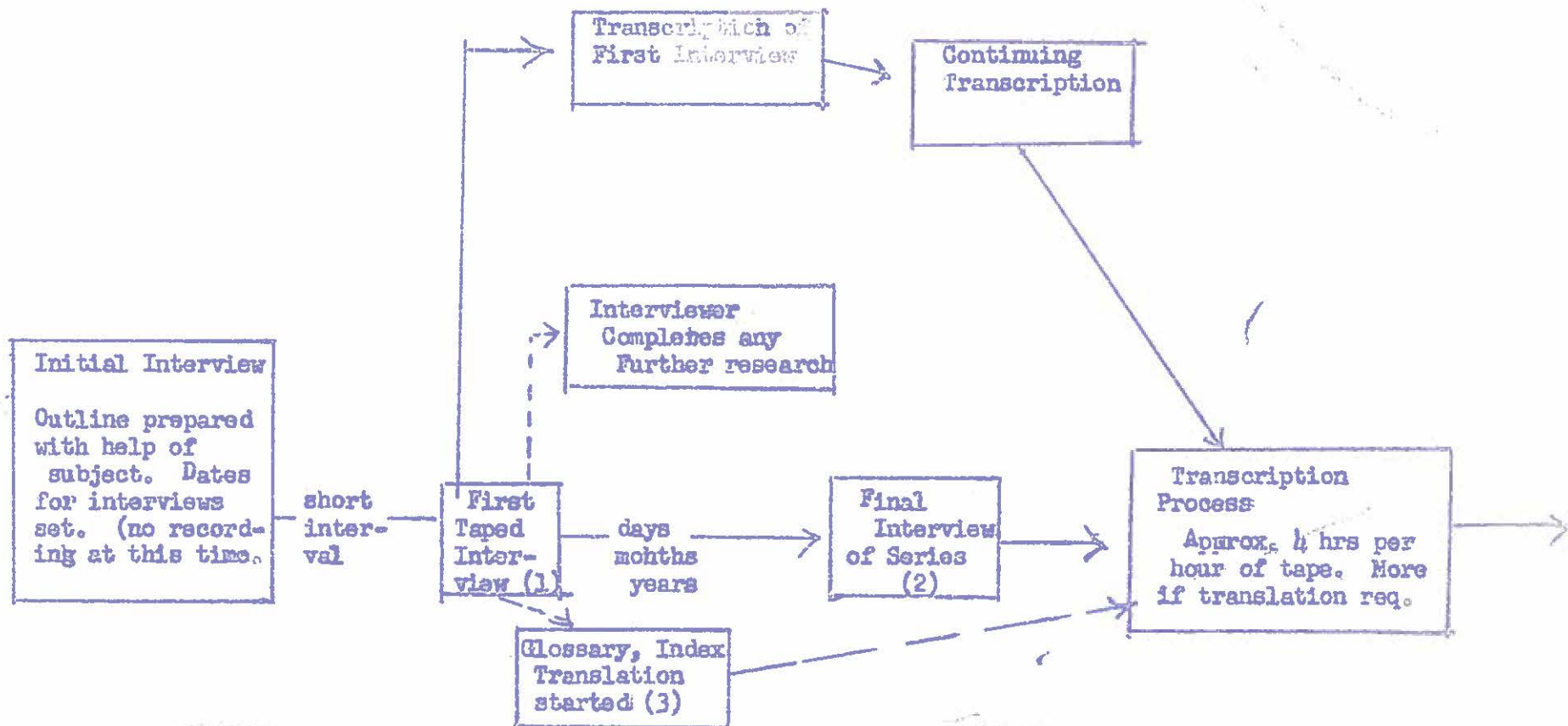
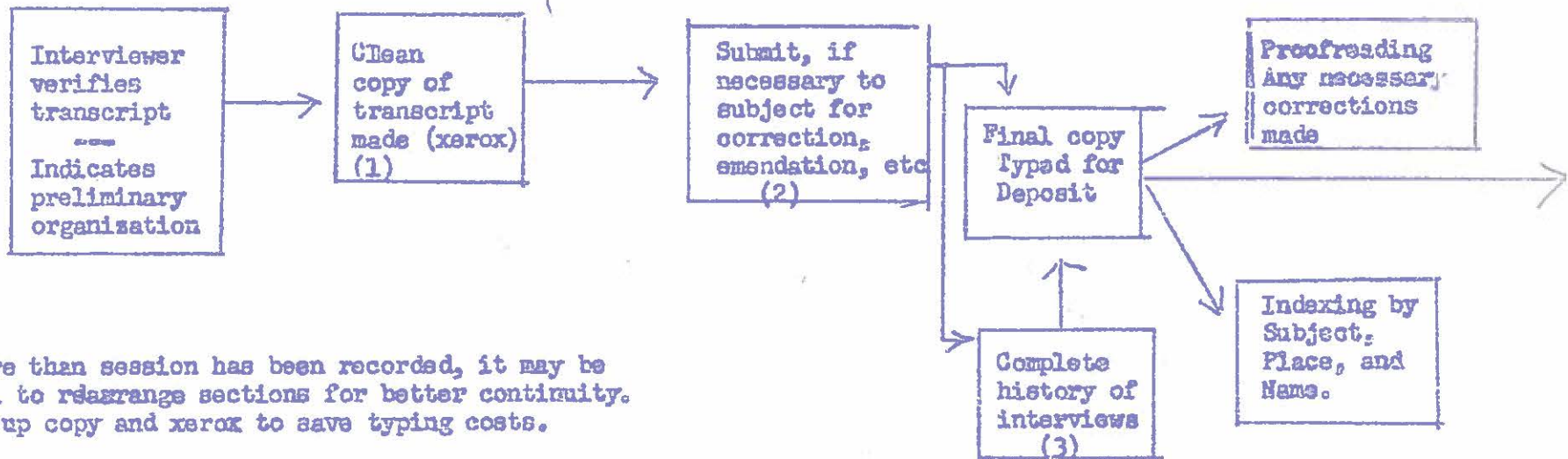


The Oral History Process





1. If more than one session, limit to two to three hours
2. Accomplish after careful review of series. Attempt to plug all loopholes, etc.
3. Technical, colloquialisms
 translation should be accomplished rapidly as possible



1. If more than session has been recorded, it may be useful to rearrange sections for better continuity. Paste up copy and xerox to save typing costs.
2. Not all interviews will be sent back to subject for editing. Prominent persons will usually ask for this step.
3. All pertinent details of the interview sessions and any special observations of the interviewer should be prepared for bidding with the final copy.
