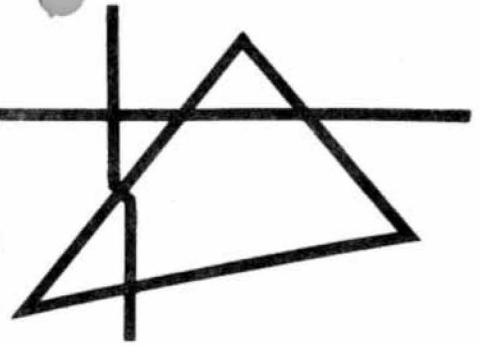

The University of Guam is soliciting applications for the following position:

SALARY LEVEL 22 \$20,640.00 - \$27,660.00 PER ANNUM

Character of Duties: Under the general administrative direction of the Dean, Graduate School and Research, the Director works with wide latitude within the University and general community in providing leadership in the development of resources and promotion of research activities within the social sciences and related disciplines applicable to the Micronesian region.

Preferred Minimum Qualification: Earned Ph.D. in a social science discipline, e.g., history, political science, anthropology, sociology, linguistics, geography, etc., from an accredited University plus three (3) years of experience in academic or research administration, and a recent record of successful research and publications relevant to the Micronesian region.

Benefits: The selected applicant will receive a two-year contract which includes 1) roundtrip economy airfare between point of hire for himself/herself and immediate family, 2) shipment of 2,500 pounds of household goods, and miscellaneous expense of \$100. Fringe benefits include 1) hospitalization and medical plan, 2) life insurance, and 3) Government of Guam retirement plan which is partially subsidized by the Government, and 4) Workmen's Compensation.
