

## *Editorially Speaking:*

With this issue of EDUCATIONAL PERSPECTIVES, Volume 3, Number 4, we round out three years of continuous publication of our College of Education Journal. These three years have been important ones. Our former editor, Dr. Richard Alm, and his staff were persistent in their efforts to provide "lift-off" for this vehicle which has become a significant publication in the state.

Having achieved orbital status for PERSPECTIVES, Dr. Alm assumed more complex editorial responsibilities with the NATIONAL ENGLISH TEACHERS JOURNAL. We wish him every success in his new assignment.

The present issue of PERSPECTIVES provides some clues for future directions which our current editorial board is considering. We feel that the College of Education is making significant contributions in many areas of endeavor in Hawaii and frequently, these contributions extend beyond the boundary of our state. An example of a broadly significant development in our program is Educational Television. When our statewide ETV station becomes a reality it will be a part of, and will contribute to, the national development of educational television. The articles included in this issue present an unusually complete "picture" of ETV: nationally, statewide, and locally. We are fortunate to have assembled in a brief period of time such a splendid collection of manuscripts for inclusion in EDUCATIONAL PERSPECTIVES.

Credit for a prodigious amount of work in assembling this material must go to Mr. Robert Reed, Associate Director of the Communications Center at the University of Hawaii. Without his enthusiastic cooperation we could not have attempted the scope of coverage which is presented.

In forthcoming issues of EDUCATIONAL PERSPECTIVES our three Associate Editors will "carry the ball" with special issues. Dr. Melvin Ezer has been at work for several months collecting material for our March issue which will be focused toward the *East-West Center and Education*; Dr. Eloise Hayes is currently preparing our June issue which will cover some aspects of *The Creative Arts in Education*; and Dr. Ralph Stueber and Dr. Lowell Jackson are collaborating on an issue to be published in October 1965, *Policies in Education*. Other issues in the planning stages are *The Laboratory School on the University Campus* and *Research in Education*.

To accomplish publication of these various issues will require the cooperation of all our faculty, and many of our readers will be approached for help in preparation of manuscripts, or in reacting to material submitted for publication. And most important, manuscripts for inclusion in PERSPECTIVES are necessary before any issue can exist. Our planning around central themes does not suggest that other material of timely general interest will not be included. We invite our readers to submit manuscripts for inclusion in future issues.
